I'm glad to Uncle Art is well and around again.

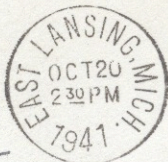
I have seen one of the new tools and they certainly are swell looking on the outside. Glad to get your card dad. I also received a nice letter from Aunt Marion this week.
